Please place yard waste in a "Kraft" bag or 10-30 gallon trash can, weighing no more than 50 lbs., and cut brush and branches (no greater than 3" in diameter) to 4' in length and tie in bundles with rope or twine.

Keep Children Safe, Playground Safety Tips

Now that the weather is warm, children are out and about in the parks. Safe Kids Worldwide reports that falls are the most common type of playground-related injury. They offer the following tips to protect children:

Supervise children and make sure that they only play on age-appropriate equipment.

Dress children appropriately in clothing that is free of strangling hazards that can get caught on the equipment such as dresses, drawstrings, necklaces, hoods, and scarves.

Instruct children not to push.

Keep Your Home from Going Up in Smoke from Wildfires

When we think of Pennsylvania, we don't necessarily think of wildfires; however, this past spring, more than 100 wildfires broke out in the Keystone State between April 19 and 26. Most wildfires occur in the spring and the fall and people were at fault for 98% of the 630 reported fires last year, according to Governor Tom Corbett.

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) stresses the importance that homeowners realize that embers and small flames are the leading cause of most of the damage. They offer the following advice to protect your home:

Keep roofs and gutters clean and free of leaves and needles.

Keep flat surfaces such as decks and porches clear of debris that could burn underneath.

Remove large potential heat sources, such as piles of firewood, spare building materials, and vehicles from your lawn and keep them a safe distance from your home.

Examine the area around your home for mulch, woody shrubs and plants that could ignite and touch the house.

Clear corners and nooks and crannies that tend to collect debris.

Trim limbs and branches to 10 feet away from the roof and house.

Township Receives Annual Recycling Grant

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection awarded an Act 101 Recycling Program Performance Grant in the amount of \$210,323 to the Recycling Center for collecting 15,125.0 tons of residential and commercial materials for recycling in 2012. Congratulations to the residents and businesses in Derry Township who are committed to recycling and helping the environment. The grant amount increased \$90,909 from the 2011 award!

Planning Commission Activities

The Planning Commission considered the following at their June 3rd meeting:

The Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for the Pennsylvania State Police Historical, Educational, and Memorial Center, Plat #1241. The subject property is located north of Hersheypark Drive and west of Laudermilch Road, and is improved with a 2,400-square-foot building that contains the Pennsylvania State Police Historical, Educational, and Memorial Center. Plat #1241 depicts a 3,285-square-foot addition to the building, as well the development of 29 parking spaces, 2 handicapped-accessible parking spaces, and 1 loading/unloading space. The Commission recommended approval of the plan, subject to the outstanding comments of staff, Herbert, Rowland, and Grubic,Inc., and the Dauphin County Planning Commission being satisfactorily addressed.

The Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for the Hershey Lodge Natatorium Replacement, Plat #1242. The plan depicts the demolition of the existing indoor and outdoor pool facilities at the Hershey Lodge (located along Governor Road and University Drive) and the creation of a leisure pool area, whirlpool area, children's pool area, and exterior spray pad area. The use of these facilities will be limited to guests of the Lodge. The Commission recommended approval of the plan, subject to the outstanding comments of staff, Herbert, Rowland, and Grubic,Inc., and the Derry Township Municipal Authority being satisfactorily addressed.
