Ribbon Cutting Ceremony Marks Completion of the Hershey Square Project

Planning for the Hershey Square improvement project began 13 years ago to improve vehicular and pedestrian safety at the center of town. Construction began in 2010 to realign Cocoa Avenue and Park Avenue, creating one intersection and replacing the bridge over Norfolk Southern Railroad. Pedestrian mobility was enhanced with an underpass under Park Avenue and Chocolate Avenue, pedestrian timers at the intersections



and textured crosswalks. The cost of project totaled \$13,551,793 and was funded through Federal Transportation Funds, State Transportation Funds, and Dauphin County Gaming Funds. The Derry Township Supervisors held a ribbon cutting ceremony on Tuesday, May 27 to acknowledge completion of this monumental project and to thank the many elected public officials and stakeholders that took part in the project.

Board of Supervisors' May 27, 2014 Meeting Highlights

Chief Patrick O'Rourke presented 23 awards recognizing the outstanding performance of members of the police Department. Further details will be provided in the Fall issue of the Township News.

Resolution No. 1392 was adopted in support of Senate Bill No. 1340 and House Bill No. 1272, authorizing Municipal Police Officers to utilize the same speed timing devices as the PA State Police.

A proposal from the township's engineer, Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc. was approved to perform monitoring services for the stream channel on Cocoa Avenue, as required by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

The use of a third-party Sewage Enforcement Officer was approved as required by (DEP) to administer the Sewage Facilities Act.

Resolution No. 1393 was adopted to establish and revise fees for services provided through the Department of Community Development.

Ordinance No. 645 was approved to establish "no parking" restrictions on Quail Hollow Road and Stoney Run Road.

A contract was awarded to E.J. Breneman in the amount of \$244,944.80 for roadwork on Beech Avenue, Cherry Drive, Cedar Avenue, and Maple Avenue.
