

6. On-Lot Sewage System Permits and Services under Chapter 161 of the Code of Ordinances*

a. On-lot sewage system testing fees:

- (i) Soil probes – \$130.00 per lot, per visit, for up to 3 probes per lot; thereafter \$45.00 per probe.
- (ii) Percolation testing performed by Township SEO (excluding digging of holes):
 - For primary areas - \$300.00 per percolation test for up to 6 holes/tests.
 - For alternate area, if tested at the same time as primary area - \$270.00 per percolation test for up to 6 holes/tests.
- (iii) Percolation test observation (percolation test performed by certified SEO hired by applicant):
 - For full test observation of primary area test - \$300.00 per percolation test.
 - For full test observation of alternate test, if tested at the same time as primary area - \$270.00 per percolation test.
- (iv) Percolation test holes (dug upon request of applicant) - \$110.00 per 6-hole test.

b. On-lot sewage system permits - \$50.00 administration/application fee, plus:

- (i) For new in-ground bed/trench system - \$260.00 review/inspection fee.
- (ii) For new pressure in-ground system - \$290.00 review/inspection fee.
- (iii) For new sandmound or at-grade system - \$310.00 review/inspection fee.
- (iv) For new drip or spray irrigation system - \$400.00 review/inspection fee.
- (v) For existing system repair - \$170.00 review/inspection fee.
- (vi) Additional inspections due to non-conformities - \$100.00 per inspection.
- (vii) Additional reviews due to non-conformities - \$80.00 per review.

c. Other fees:

- (i) Mileage will be charged at the current Department of Environmental Protection-approved rate per mile.
- (ii) Rate for all other work not included in Items 6.a. and 6.b. above - \$65.00 per hour (1 hour minimum).

8. Planning Modules under Chapter 161 and/or Chapter 185 of the Code of Ordinances*

a. Non-Building Waiver or Planning Exception:

(i) Public sewer system forms - \$25.00.

(ii) On-lot septic system forms - \$150.00.

b. Planning Module components – \$300.00.
