

The department of Community Development for Derry Township has seen a welcomed return to normalcy in its planning and zoning duties since the initial COVID-19 lockdown was lifted. While the department has limited in-person meetings as much as possible, the staff has been proficient in using various video conferencing apps to meet the needs of its patrons and conduct business efficiently. Community Development expects to see an uptick in residential permit applications as we head towards spring and the nicer weather it brings. Since June 1, 2020, the Department has received 601 building/zoning permits, issued 630 building and zoning permits and performed 1,997 building and violation inspections. While we prepare for a fresh year of permits and plans, here is a review of the plans approved since June 1, 2020.

THE THREE PLANS THAT HAVE BEEN RECORDED BY THE DAUPHIN COUNTY RECORDER OF DEEDS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- Cacao Way, to be leased by the Hershey Trust Company and developed by Cacao Way LLC. The plan calls for the structure at 50 Northeast Dr. to be razed and a new 75-unit apartment building to be constructed on the site. The Cacao Way master plan was recorded on June 18, 2020.
- Lots 4, 6, 7, 8 Consolidation and New Academic Support Building Lot 9, owned by The Pennsylvania State University and developed by Penn State Health Milton S. Hershey Medical Center. The plan consolidates multiple individual lots along Hope Dr. and creates a new lot along Academic Drive and Hope Drive. This plan proposes no building development. The plan was recorded on July, 23 2020.

• Hershey High Pointe which is owned and being developed by Hershey IDP Partners, LLC. The highlights of this revised plan are the demolition of vacant buildings once used as the Alpine Nursing Home, the construction of more than 30 new condominiums plus adding a 39-unit apartment building to the property. This plan was recorded on August 7, 2020.

MAR & APR	Continue removal of the existing line until complete.Will begin restoration of grass areas in April.




MILTON HERSHEY'S LESSER-KNOWN EARLY VENTURES: Apprenticeship Errors and Efforts

Many know that prior to introducing his wildly popular Hershey's Milk Chocolate, Milton Hershey found his first success in caramels with the Lancaster Caramel Company. However, Lancaster Caramel was far from the first stop in Mr. Hershey's professional ventures – even in the candy industry.

his is the first in a series of articles focusing on the lesser-known early ventures of Milton S. Hershey and how they shaped and influenced his later success.

Milton Hershey's first venture into the confectionery industry came when he was 14 years old. In 1872 he began an apprenticeship in Lancaster with Joseph Royer at Royer's Ice Cream Parlor and Garden at 50-52 West King Street (now Rick's Deli).

However, this was not young Milton's first apprenticeship. His practical education began 150 years ago, in 1871. Originally, his father, Henry Hershey, encouraged him to take an apprenticeship in Gap, PA with a printer named Samuel Ernst. Milton served as a "printer's devil," or assistant in a print shop. Henry thought this opportunity would make his son a "man of letters." However, working for the publisher of the German language newspaper, Der Waffenlose Waechter (or the Weaponless Watchman), did not hold young Milton's interest. The boy also showed very little talent for typesetting and was relieved of his position

just a few months after beginning. Paul A.W. Wallace, Hershey biographer, described the last straw in his unpublished 1956 manuscript *Milton S. Hershey*: "Milton had a temper like [Ernst's], not sullen but explosive. One day he dropped his wide-brimmed straw hat ('accidentally on purpose,' he said afterwards) in the press, with interesting typographical consequences [...] Sam Ernst fired him on the spot."

enclosed with bushes, trees, and vines, creating a cool and pretty place to relax and enjoy an ice cream treat. Royer's sold

a heaping plate of their own ice cream for ten cents. Their most popular dish was a

plate of ice cream with lemon squares. The confectionery store's popularity was noted in a 1909 article in the *Reading Eagle* newspaper:

"Every student who has been at Franklin and Marshall College remembers Joe Royer. It was his confectionery with an ice cream garden attached that the students visited and to which they took their girls."

Joseph Royer was a true confectioner of his time, making not just ice cream, but a number of varieties of candy. The confectionery treats at Royer's included caramels, cough drops, bon-bons, rock and sugar candies, as well as ice cream and lemon pastries. Chocolate was not yet widely available at this time. Any chocolate confections at Royer's would have been limited to chocolate-coated and flavored candies.

Milton Hershey did not learn the candy trade immediately. As a new apprentice at Royer's, he waited on tables, took orders at the counter, and delivered ice cream and candy to customers' houses. His first jobs in the kitchen entailed washing dishes and ice cream cans.

The hardest job he was assigned was turning the handle of the big ice cream freezer.

It was not until his mother intervened and offered more money to Royer that Milton began to learn the art of candy making. Royer soon discovered that his apprentice had a gift for mixing ingredients and creating candies. Candy made in the 1870s was created through experimentation and with traditions passed down from generation to generation. Recipes were very vague, consisting of ingredients and some general instruction. Many

were not written down but created from memory. Milton Hershey had to learn how to combine ingredients and understand the role of heat and time. He had to learn how to feel the "crack" of the candy, the right moment to remove a batch from the kettle.

With this process of trial and error, there were often blunders along with successes. Wallace described one instance:

"Best of all he liked to tell how one evening, when he had been roasting peanuts for peanut fudge, he forgot everything and went round the corner with a companion to see a show in the old Fulton Opera House from the vantage ground of 'Peanut Heaven' (i.e., the top gallery) where the boys used to congregate. He sat absorbed in the show until, through an open window, there came the smell of burning peanuts. When he and his companion raced down the stairs and out into the street. they found, as [Milton] used to say, 'a shower of peanut shells coming down.' He had forgotten to turn the blower off, and the burned shells were coming up the flu and blowing about the ice cream garden like leaves."

that would form the foundation of his future success. In 1876, with his apprenticeship completed, he left Lancaster to establish his very own candy business in Philadelphia.

Our next article will delve into the next influential period of Mr. Hershey's early life, so stay tuned!


